

"CASE - O - PEDIA": Management of a radicular groove by combined endodontic therapy & intentional reimplantation

The radicular groove is a developmental anomaly characterized by a depression or concavity found on the lingual surface of maxillary incisors particularly the maxillary lateral incisors. It may represent infolding of inner enamel epithelium (enamel organ) and Hertwig's epithelial root sheath. This presentation reports clinical & radiographic features, management and follow-up of a case of complete palato-radicular groove in maxillary lateral incisor with pulpal and periodontal involvement.

Intraoral

Case Report

A 16-year-old boy visited the Department of Pedodontics and Preventive Dentistry, with a chief complaint of recurrent pain in left upper front tooth since last six months.


Intraoral Examination


Anterior crowding was observed in the maxillary

On careful inspection of tooth 22, a groove was detected on distopalatal surface extending from the crown to the gingival sulcus associated with periodontal pocket measuring around 5 mm. No periodontal pocket was observed on the labiaspect of the tooth.

Mild gingival inflammation was present on the distopalatal aspect of tooth 22. However, Mobilwas within normal physiologic limit. Tooth 22 was normal in colour. Neither sinus nor swelling was observed i.r.t. affected tooth. Patient didn't give any history of trauma

On Palpation there was no depression or swelling and the affected tooth was tender to percussion. Pulp vitality test: Negative.





Diagnosis

Diagnosis of pulp necrosis with apical and localized periodontitis associated complete radicular groove was made in respect to tooth 22. (Endoperio lesion)

Outline Treatment

Atraumatic Tooth removal (Periotome & Forceps)

- Fissurectomy/odontoplasty/radiculoplasty/ enameloplasty of coronal and cervical radicular groove.
- Sealing of prepared groove with GIC Replantation and radiograph.
- Splinting: The teeth did not require stabilization with splints as the teeth were slightly cut off from occlusion with suitable overjet.
- Post-operative instructions, Medication and chlorhexidine mouthwash (to prevent contamination that may lead to inflammatory root resorption) Suture removal Follow up at 1st, 3rd and 6th months.



After a week, healing was uneventful & tooth mobility was within normal physiologic limit. At 1 month & 3 months the periodontal tissues appeared healthy and no inflammatory signs and symptoms were observed. Probing depths were not measured as it was early for probing the depth of periodontal pocket treated with regenerative procedures. At 6 months probing depth of 2 mm was recorded which shows gain in clinical attachment levels

Conclusion

Effective recognition of the palatal radicular grooves is critical, especially because of their diagnostic complexity and the problems that may arise if they are not properly interpreted and treated. Deep radicular grooves can predispose to pulp necrosis and the establishment of combined endodontic periodontal problems.

Our students at Saraswati Dental College have not only excelled in academics but have also brought laurels in co-curricular activities.




